


Creative Whitlam
















What's on in Whitlam


Staying Active in Winter

Whitlam School Update

The ACT Government is planning for a new public primary school and co-located early childhood education and care service in the suburb of Whitlam.

Through the planning phase of the project our delivery partner has advised us on an updated completion date which will now see the first stage of the new school open for term 1 in 2027.

We know this might be disappointing news for some families, particularly those intending to enrol their children in the 2026 school year. Evelyn Scott School will remain the Priority Enrolment school for Whitlam.

It is important to the government that our infrastructure projects continue to deliver the best value for money

for Canberrans and meet community expectations, while also navigating the rising costs and skills shortages across the construction industry which can cause construction delays.

The Department of Education Directorate will continue to keep the community updated on the progress of the new public school in Whitlam through website updates, local newsletters, and community engagements.

Green Waste

Do you have a green waste bin? You can order one online for a one-off registration fee, or free for residents with one of these concession cards:

- **ACTION Gold Card**
- Department of Veterans' Affairs Gold Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- ACT Seniors Card.

Garden waste is accepted in the light green lidded bin. It's important to keep garden waste out of your landfill bin to reduce the creation of the harmful greenhouse gas, methane, in landfill.

What can go in your green waste bin?

Branches (no longer than 45cm and a diameter of 10cm), leaves, prunings, bamboo (all varieties), weeds, wood chips, grass clippings and flowers.

Household green waste can be dropped off for free at Mugga Lane Resource Management Centre (Corkhill Bros) for recycling. Please note that fees apply to oversized branches or trees (larger than 20cm in diameter and/or 2m in length).
