Ask Anna: "Is that a Snake?!"

I've been asked by lots of residents about snakes, as there have been a few sightings in the area lately. As the weather warms up, it's important to be aware of snakes in your area.

- When walking in gardens or bushland, always watch where you're stepping, and avoid tall grass and bushy areas. If you see a snake, remain calm, keep a safe distance, and do not threaten it. If you back away slowly —most snakes will retreat on their own.
- **To stay safe at home**, keep your yard tidy by removing debris and tall grass, which can attract snakes. Make sure to seal any gaps in fences and check for holes around the house and ensure pet food and water bowls are not accessible to wildlife.

Remember that snakes are generally shy animals and perform an important ecosystem function by managing animals like mice which could become a problem without their predation.

Educating yourself and your family about snake behaviour can help everyone stay safe during the warmer months. If you encounter a snake that poses a threat, contact a local wildlife service for assistance.

Deep Creek Dam

There is a new recreational area coming to Whitlam! The Suburban Land Agency is creating a large, deepwater pond to manage the area's stormwater. This will protect the Molonglo River from pollution and support future construction of roads, power and water connections, while also providing an attractive, recreational area.

Temporarily, local residents can expect to hear some additional noise from this construction and there may be dust and traffic impacts while the dam is constructed, however, this will be temporary and, once complete, diverse plantings, a shared pedestrian and cycle path will provide residents with amenity. Construction of this pond will take place from early 2025 through early 2027.
