
















What's on in Whitlam

Platypus Month

August is Platypus Month and Whitlam residents can join Waterwatch all month on walks and surveys in the Namarag Reserve, along the Molonglo River Corridor. Find more information here act.waterwatch.org.au/programs/platypus-month

If you can't make it to the walks, you can still do your bit. Platypus need clean water to live and thrive. What we do upstream really does matter.

- Take care that fertiliser, leaves, grass clippings, soil and pet waste do not wash down the stormwater drain near your house.
- Fertilise with low-phosphorous products and less often.
- When you're out and about pick up any "O" shaped litter such as rubber bands, bottle rings and fishing nets so that they do not trap platypus' legs or beak.
- Keep dogs on leads around lakes and waterways.


