FORMER TRANSPORT DEPOT ROOF REMEDIATION CONTINUES

Remediation works are continuing on one of Canberra's historic buildings, the Former Transport Depot. These improvements will continue to support its vibrancy and creative form within the Kingston Arts Precinct.

Remediation of the building's roof has commenced with expected completion by April 2014 and includes the replacement of the asbestos cement roofing of the building's upper hall. Removal of the northern annex and the demolition of the former Kingston Forensic Medical Facility are planned to commence in May 2014 (subject to Planning approvals).

While these works continue, the Old Bus Depot Markets are operating as normal each Sunday from the lower level of the Kingston Transport Depot, the heritage listed Fitter's Workshop and the nearby Lakeside Gallery.

LAND SALES UPDATE - THE PENINSULA

Three premium sites located on Kingston Foreshore's The Peninsula precinct will be auctioned this month. The sites are positioned on the waterfront close to the Boardwalk. The Peninsula will offer the perfect combination of excitement and ambience complete with views of harbourside cafes and restaurants, the tranquil Norgrove Park and Jerrabomberra Wetlands are also only a short walk away.

A SWEET WALK SET ALONG HONEYSETT VIEW

Landscaping has commenced along the waterfront setting at Honeysett View. Visitors can look forward to new footpaths, boat shaped viewing decks and trees which will make the area a pleasant place to visit, relax and view the wider Kingston Foreshore precinct.

The use of 'natural, raw' materials is a consistent theme throughout Kingston Foreshore. This theme can be seen through the boat shaped viewing decks which are made of the distinctive 'rusty looking' corten steel. The rock spill material surrounding the viewing decks is also widely used in landscaping throughout Kingston Foreshore.

The project is scheduled for completion by June 2014.

CONSTRUCTION AND LANDSCAPING UPDATES

We're delighted to see increased pedestrian, cycle and social activity at Kingston Foreshore. Here's what you can look forward to experiencing on your next walk.

The park located between the Waterfront and Aurora apartments, is now complete with uninterrupted waterfront views ready to be enjoyed.

The Harbour and Promenade can now be accessed from the water, take a kayak or canoe and see Kingston Foreshore from a completely different view!

Landscaping along the restaurant section of The Promenade is also complete and this area is in the process of being handed over to TAMS. Landscaping is continuing along the rest of The Promenade with the eastern end along Honeysett View due for completion in mid 2014 and the area between the Harbour and the new Element development expected to be completed by late 2015.



PARKING RESTRICTIONS AT KINGSTON FORESHORE

Kingston Foreshore residents and businesses were contacted by Roads ACT in the Territory and Municipal Services Directorate (TAMS) in response to concerns received about street parking restrictions along Eastlake Parade and Trevillian Quay.

In response to these concerns, by mid 2014, a 2 hour time limit for parking will be implemented between 7:30am and 6pm from Monday to Friday.
